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Let Your Voice Be Heard, South Central Pennsylvania!

In partnership with the Department of Human Services Office of Children, Youth, and Families, the Resource Center is seeking parents to participate in an invitation only town hall style meeting with Deputy Secretary Laval Miller-Wilson. The Deputy Secretary's aim is to promote parents as leaders and strategic partners to inform policy and practice. To this end, he would like to meet with parents who have lived experience within Pennsylvania's child welfare system for an open discussion about their views on the successes of our system as well as areas for improvement.

The goal is to identify parents from across the state for quarterly in-person meetings. The first meeting will be held on November 14, 2023, at the Resource Center focusing on a small group of parents (about 10-15) in the south central part of the state.

Parents identified for participation in this meeting must have the following:

- Reside in Adams, Bedford, Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Fulton, Huntingdon, Juniata, Mifflin, Lancaster, Lebanon, Perry, or York County;
- Past involvement with a Pennsylvania County Children and Youth agency including in-home and out-of-home placement in which reunification has occurred;
- The family's case must be closed with the County Children and Youth agency at the time of application; and
- The family cannot have connection to an open case with the County Children and Youth office through a family member.

Additional opportunities for advocacy may come as a result of this experience for interested parents. Attached is the flyer, which has more information about the event and how to register. If you know a parent who qualifies to participate, please share the flyer with them. If you know a parent that lives outside of the current target counties but meets the other criteria, you can also provide them with a flyer as their information will be taken for possible participation in future events. Please note that the goal of this project is to improve family engagement at all levels of Pennsylvania's child welfare system. Information learned during this town hall will not be used by the Office of Children, Youth, and Families to target corrective action toward a specific county agency.

- Do you want to have the opportunity to share your insights, expertise, and perspectives?




