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NYTD is more than a survey. It is a movement to ensure that every youth has access to the resources they need to successfully transition out of foster care into adulthood.

What is NYTD?

This federal program requires states to collect information on youth transitioning out of foster care.

The Administration for Children and Families (ACF) requires states to compile and report data about these youth every six months.

There are two components – youth outcomes (survey-driven) and independent living services (service-driven).

In PA, data is collected via the **GetNYTDPA.org** website.



Youth Outcomes

Baseline surveys are administered to all 17-year-olds in out-of-home care

Follow-up surveys are administered to a random sample of baseline youth when they turn 19 and 21

Six outcomes are measured via baseline & follow-up surveys:

Financial self-sufficiency

Experience with homelessness

Educational attainment

Positive connection with adults

High-risk behavior

Access to health insurance



Independent Living (IL) Service / Served Data

Any IL service **paid for or provided** by the agency, regardless of the youth's age:


- Special education
- Independent living needs assessment
- Academic support
- Post-secondary educational support
- Career preparation
- Employment programs or vocational training

- Budget and financial management
- Housing education and home management training
- Health education and risk prevention
- Family support/healthy marriage education
- Mentoring

- Supervised independent living
- Room and board financial assistance
- Education financial assistance
- Other financial assistance

There is always a baseline, or a follow-up survey being conducted in any year



Youth Surveys - Baseline

Baseline survey data are submitted to the federal government every third FFY

A new baseline year is being conducted this year, FFY 2023

Baseline surveys are to be completed by every 17-year-old in foster care on their **17th birthday** or who enter care up to 45 days **following that 17th birthday**

Counties are responsible for administering and educating youth on the importance of completing baseline surveys

The state must achieve an **80 percent** participation rate



Youth Surveys - Follow-up

Follow-Up surveys are administered two and four years after baseline surveys

A random sample of participants is identified for follow-up surveys

PCG is responsible for administering both follow-up surveys

The state is penalized if the response rate is below 60 percent

• Exclusions for incarceration, incapacitation or death



Educate Youth & Maintain Engagement

It is important to educate young adults about NYTD when they participate in the 17-year-old baseline survey

- they may be contacted at ages 19 and/or 21 to complete follow-up survey
- there are gift card incentives for completing these follow-up surveys

Continuously engage youth

- As you know, life circumstances can be fluid for these youth
- Maintain accurate contact information in order to facilitate follow-up surveys

An answer to at least one outcome question constitutes a valid survey



Independent Living (IL) Service / Served Data

At the **end of every six-month period**, counties will either enter service data at GetNYTDPA.org or submit a spreadsheet to PCG.

- Youth's MCI Number
- Youth's name
- Youth's demographics
- Youth's highest achieved education level
- Yes/No for each service category
- Service data must be submitted within 15 days of the end of the period
- This is for both "A" Period (April 15th) and "B" Period (October 15th)

It is recommended that counties update their IL service data on an ongoing basis to improve accuracy of data and to minimize challenges with end-of-period submission deadlines





Youth Employed Full-Time










More youth are employed part-time than full-time.

Youth Employed Part-Time













Youth Receiving Employment-Related Skills Training















As youth get older, they receive more financial aid.

Youth Receiving Financial Aid












Many youth are not receiving public assistance.

Youth Receiving Public Assistance











As youth get older, they are less likely to be enrolled in some type of educational institution or program.

Youth Enrolled at an Educational Institution or Participating in an Educational Program












But, as youth get older, they are more likely to either be working or enrolled in school.








As youth age, they are more likely to face barriers to education.






Emotional Support



Many youth report that they have an adult to turn to for advice or emotional support.


Youth with a Positive, Consistent, and Lasting Relationship with At Least One Adult







The closest trusting, supportive, and unconditional relationship for youth are usually their relatives.









A large percentage of youth say there has been a lot of help to maintain or strengthen their relationships with the family members whom they feel close to.









Most youth have never been homeless.

Youth Who Have Experienced Homelessness














As youth get older, they are less likely to have been referred to alcohol or drug abuse assessment or counseling.

Youth Being Referred for Alcohol or Drug Use Assessment or Counseling














Overall, youth were less likely to be confined for allegedly committing a crime as they aged.

Youth with a History of Incarceration




















Many youth responded that they received all the mental health care they thought they needed.






Preparing for NYTD

FFY 2023 Baseline Survey

- A Baseline Survey must be completed when
 - a youth turns 17 while in out-of-home care or enters out-of-home care within 45 days following their 17th birthday
- During the year, the group is divided into two parts based on the youth's date of birth:
- "A" sample: youth with 17th birthday between
 Oct 2022 March 2023
 - Surveys are to be completed by April 15th,
 2023
- "B" sample: youth with 17th birthday between
 April 2023 Sept. 2023
 - Surveys are to be completed by October 15th, 2023




FFY 2023 Baseline Survey

When a youth becomes eligible for a baseline survey, register them in **GetNYTDPA.org**, including:

- Name
- MCI number
- Demographics (DOB, race, ethnicity)
- GetNYTDPA.org will provide a seven-character
 "passcode" that allows the youth to complete the survey
- Youth then enters that passcode at GetNYTDPA.org to complete the survey






FFY 2023 Baseline Surveys

• A random sample of youth who complete a baseline survey in FFY 2023 will participate in the 19- and 21-year-old follow up surveys in FFYs 2025 and 2027

 The county is responsible for registering eligible youth and administering the baseline survey, but PCG can and does provide support if needed





County NYTD Responsibilities

County NYTD Responsibilities

Record on an **ongoing basis** which youth are receiving any of the fifteen independent living services that must be reported through NYTD

- Send data to PCG after period ends on September 30th
- Send data to PCG after period ends on March 31st
- Keep sending data to PCG at the end of each six-month period
- Through September 30th, during a **Baseline Year**, when a youth turns 17 **while in out-of-home care**, or **enters out of home care** within 45 days following their 17th birthday:
 - Register the youth in GetNYTDPA.org and get a passcode
 - Administer the survey to the youth or give them the passcode and GetNYTDPA.org address
- Through September 30th, during a Follow-Up Year for 19-year-olds and 21-year-olds:
 - Administer the survey to the youth or give them the passcode and GetNYTDPA.org address
 - Coordinate with PCG in identifying viable contact information for youth in the follow up sample

Challenges and What's Working

Challenges

- Difficulty locating youth when they have moved out of state
- Receiving assistance in searching for youth in follow up surveys
- Youths' lack of knowledge about NYTD surveys
- Problems with adequate staffing and retention
- Large case loads
- Youths' lack of interest



What's Working

- Working with youth over the phone to complete surveys
- Utilizing multiple way to reach youth
- Remaining in constant contact with youth through IL services
- Utilizing youths' IL coordinator, their case worker and/or their former foster parent to connect
- Nominal incentives such as gift cards
- Sending youth birthday cards every year



Tracking 17 Year Olds for NYTD Baseline Survey


- Track youth age through ICAMS (CAPS)
- Spreadsheets
- Online database with automatic IT alert 30 days prior to youth turning 17
- Admin tracks youth birthdays, registers in NYTD system, and notifies IL staff
- Prep IL staff before youth should be registered
- Weekly CYS reports
