National Responsible Fatherhood Clearinghouse Guidelines for Working with Fathers

- 1. Always have high expectations for all fathers with whom you work.
- 2. Never be judgmental. Recognize your biases and manage them.
- 3. Start where the father is, not where you think he should be, or where stereotypes may lead you.
- 4. Be respectful and understand cultural definitions of masculinity.
- 5. Communicate on as even of playing field as possible, do not assume superiority.
- 6. Be patient and willing to hang in there as most fathers in the system will experience ups and downs throughout the process.
- 7. Demonstrate genuine and ongoing caring.
- 8. Earn their trust through honesty.
- 9. Utilize language and messages to which men can respond.
- 10. Ask explorative questions in a non-threatening manner.
- 11. Allow time for the father to respond to your questions.
- 12. Allow conversation to occur with fathers while doing something else
 - i. i.e. while watching the child(ren) play together
- 13. Do not make false promises.
- 14. Assume that men can be reached, look for ways to meet specific needs and be prepared to follow-up.
- 15. Try to relate to the father in a genuine way.
