

Challenging Perceptions of FGDM Practice During the COVID-19 Pandemic



This brief illustrates a comparison of FGDM practice statewide from <u>pre-COVID-19</u> (July 1, 2018 to February 29, 2020; 20 months) to <u>COVID-19</u> (March 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021; 16 months). Coordination time, engagement of parents and supports, and participants' experiences were examined for <u>39 counties</u> that remained active in the FGDM evaluation during both time periods. There were <u>2,156</u> conferences held during pre-COVID-19 and <u>1,091</u> conferences held during COVID-19. On average, there were <u>9</u> conference attendees during pre-COVID-19 and <u>9</u> conference attendees during COVID-19. The data analyzed for this brief are based on evaluation form submissions through July 21, 2021.

Median Coordination Time by Point in Service Pathway*



■ Pre-COVID-19 ■ COVID-19


During COVID-19, there was a <u>decrease in median</u> <u>coordination times</u> for all points in the service pathway except for assessment/ investigation/ intake and aftercare.

*Due to the large variability in coordination times (0 to 2,235 days), the median days are displayed in this figure.




During COVID-19, there was a <u>slight increase in the percentage</u> <u>of both parents attending the</u> <u>conference</u> for children/youth living in kinship care, foster care, and congregate care.





Both parents attended Mom only attended Dad only attended Neither parent attended




Parental Engagement by Age of Focus Child/Youth



Among all age groups, there was a slight decrease in the percentage of neither parent attending the conference during COVID-19.

Participating Supports by Age of Focus Child/Youth



All focus children/youth agreed or strongly agreed that the conference was held in a place that "felt right" during COVID-19.

Reflection Questions

- What innovative implementation strategies were utilized during COVID-19 that led to:
 - decreases in coordination times; 0
 - increases in parental engagement; 0
 - increases in professional supports; and 0
 - 0 overwhelming agreement among focus children/youth that the conference was held in a place that "felt right"?
- Which of these implementation strategies should remain standard practice after the COVID-19 pandemic?


